- Thesis: The Bible that is in the Qur'an, Literary analysis and sources
- In this research, the author combines all the Qur'anic texts that contain stories and sayings that have traces in the Hebrew Bible, the intertestamental Jewish writings, and the New Testament. He, afterwards, proceeds to a literary analysis of this Jewish and Christian material in order to identify the sources and their literary formats: oral narratives, Targum, Aramaic writings or otherwise.

- Thesis: "The Septuagint and the Targum of Isaiah 15-17, Patterns of Bible Interpretation and Translation in the Intertestimental Period."
- The dissertation consists of reading Isaiah chapters 15-17 in the Masoretic text (Hebrew), the Septuagint (Koine Greek) and the Targum (Aramaic), making a literary analysis and an exegesis of the text in the three languages, and examining the translation method and interpretation technique applied at that time, finally comparing the applied translation method with modern Bible translation methods. This research project gave me a wide and deep view about ancient translation studies in general, about Intertestimental Judaism, and about the importance of the Septuagint and the Targum for understanding both Testaments, and the way they should be translated to other languages.

- Thesis: "Islam as the Inheritance of the Semitic Civilizations: Study of the Abrahamic Phenomenon."
- The dissertation consists of studying the Abrahamic religious phenomenon in Islam- being the most ancient "Islam" according to the Cora'ān- and searching for its sources in the Intertestimental Judaism and, less, in the early Christian traditions. Thus, Islam would have absorbed the ancient Semitic culture, while Eastern Christianity was absorbed by the West to be reshaped mainly with

Scholasticism and then resent to the Levant. This research enabled me understanding the three Abrahamic traditions: Christianity, Judaism and Islam, their common historical ground, and their different development directions; so I could become active and beneficial in the Dialogue of Civilizations and more sensitive towards translating the Bible into to other-faith audiences.

This research enabled me to make a thorough study of the Old Testament in its ancient Semitic context and to analyze and understand a number of enigmatic and ancient speech forms that exist in the Old Testament.
